Webelos Trail

The Cub Scout Webelos Trail

This trail will run Saturday only. If your Boy Scout Troop is camping at camp and you and your Adult partner wish to join them you must make arrangements with the Troop Scoutmaster to do so.

Webelos are welcome to stay for the Saturday evening programs.

When more information is available for the Cub Scout trail, it will be forwarded to you.

Scouts Basic Trail

The basic trail will consist of the following stations:

- First Aid
- Fire Building
- Map & Compass
- Knots & Lashings
- Sled Obstacle course
- Fjord
- Tomahawk toss
- Log Saw
- Ice Rescue
- Shelter Building
- Cooking

Each Patrol on the basic trail will need to provide their own food and water for the lunch time meal which they will be cooking on the trail.

Each station is 20 minutes long with 10 minutes of travel time.

Each Patrol sled must carry the following equipment on their sled:

Patrol Flag

Complete Patrol First Aid Kit

2 Staves to make a stretcher

2 blankets or sleeping bags

Cook kit and mess kits for Patrol lunch which they must cook over a fire during the lunch break on the trail.

A 6-foot piece of rope for each patrol member

Fire starting material and an axe

Compass

Repair kit for sled

Tarp

Extra clothing for each patrol member

Boy Scout handbook

The above listed is the only equipment allowed on the sleds, points will be deducted for extra equipment that is on any patrol sled.

Equipment cannot be added or replaced during the event. No adults are permitted to coach or "help" any Patrol during the event. In the event that an adult does help or coach at any station the patrol will be disqualified and receive a zero in points for that station.

Advanced Trail

The advanced trail will consist of 2 man teams. In the event of an odd number, teams will be combined with scouts from other units at the discretion of the staff of this trail.

The Advanced Trail will start with promptly at 10:30PM Friday Night.

All participants of the Advanced Trail must meet in front of Willits Dining Hall at 10:30PM.

No Late entries will be permitted.

All equipment and food required for the participants must be in a backpack and participants must carry all of their own gear to the base camp for this trail.

No additional equipment will be permitted to be dropped off for participants during this trail, each participant must be completely self sufficient.

Each participant must provide for himself and or with his partner all the necessary equipment to spend a weekend out of doors in January in any possible winter weather condition.

Each team will be responsible for providing their own food, water and shelter for the event.

All participants must be dressed appropriately which includes winter footwear, hats and gloves. At the discretion of the staff, any scout that presents himself unprepared will be sent back to their home unit and disqualified from participation until proper gear is furnished by the scouts unit.

The events of the Advanced Trail will consist of:

Basic and advanced scout skills to include fire and shelter building, map and compass, first aid, cooking, knots and lashings, outdoor ethics, sanitation, leave no trace, and emergency preparedness.

This trail will be judged from Friday at 10:30PM until the ending of the trail at 3:30PM on Saturday. It will not be a teaching Trail but an event consisting of problem solving events that each team must complete.

There will be no leaders or adults permitted to travel with the teams during the trail.

Any team that does have an adult helping or coaching will be disqualified and forfeit any points earned during the event. There is no exception to this rule.
