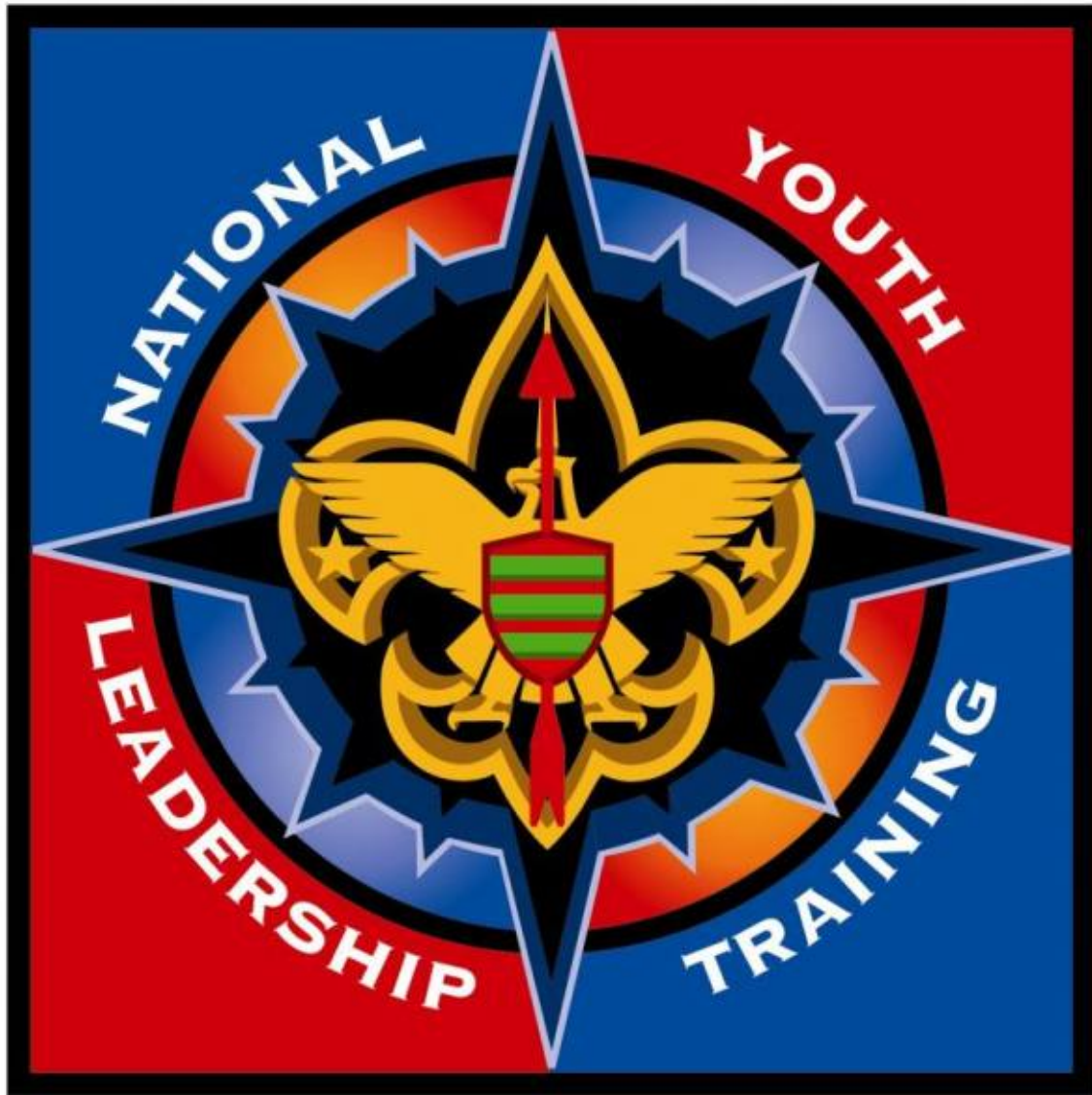

2010 National Youth Leadership Training INFORMATION

Leadership is a key factor in the development of a Boy Scout/Venturer. One of the most valuable things Scouting offers is the opportunity to be a leader and to develop his leadership skills. The National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) course provides an exceptional opportunity for the youth to do just that.

NYLT is an intensive six day training experience for Senior Patrol Leaders, Assistant Senior Patrol leaders, Patrol leaders and other youth leaders as well as prospective troop leaders and venture crew leadership. The course uses a systematic approach to teach contemporary leadership skills, with an emphasis on both theory and practical application in a Scouting context. For the Scout who desires to be a better and more effective leader NYLT is an unparalleled opportunity.

Dates & Location:

NYLT June 12, 2010 – June 17, 2010 (Saturday/Thursday) Hawk Mountain Scout Reservation

Equipment & Supplies:

Your regular Boy Scout/Venture field uniform is the official uniform of NYLT. Participants need to bring their normal camping gear for a week of camp, and will receive a detail equipment list upon registration. Patrol and troop gear, food and tentage, are provided.

Health & Safety:

NYLT is operated in accordance with the National Health and Safety Standards of the Boy Scouts of America. A medic is on call and the facilities of a local hospital and clinic are available if needed. All participants must be approved by their doctor prior to NYLT, using the new Annual Health and Medical Record form. A participant will not be allowed to begin the course without an Annual Health and Medical Record form.

Eligibility:

To participate in NYLT, a Scout must be at least 13 years of age and not reached the age of 18. He must hold at least the rank of First Class, be currently registered in a Boy Scout troop, team or Crew and have the approval of his Scoutmaster/Coach. Females that are registered in a venturing crew will also be eligible to take the course. They should be a current or prospective unit leader within the unit.

Because NYLT is an intensive training experience, participants should possess sufficient maturity, judgment and leadership potential to successfully complete the program. Each participant will be evaluated during the course on their Attitude (Be), Knowledge (Know) and Skills (Do).

Registration:

Registrations are made by completing the attached application form, including the Scoutmaster's approval and mailing it, with the reservation fee, to the Beaver Family Service Center. **Because of the benefits of this training to the unit, it is highly recommended that the unit consider paying all or part of the participant's fee.** Reservations are accepted on a first come, first served basis and the number of participants per training troop is limited. In order to insure acceptance, early reservations are recommended. Once a course is filled, a waiting list will be started and applications will be moved into the course as spaces become available due to cancellations.

Refunds:

From time to time events happen that cause participants to withdraw from the course. However, refunds or a balance transfers to a future course, will only be discussed if the withdraw is due to factors beyond the participant's or guardian's control. The Council will assess the reasons for a withdrawal and make a fair ruling in accordance with the Council refund policy.
